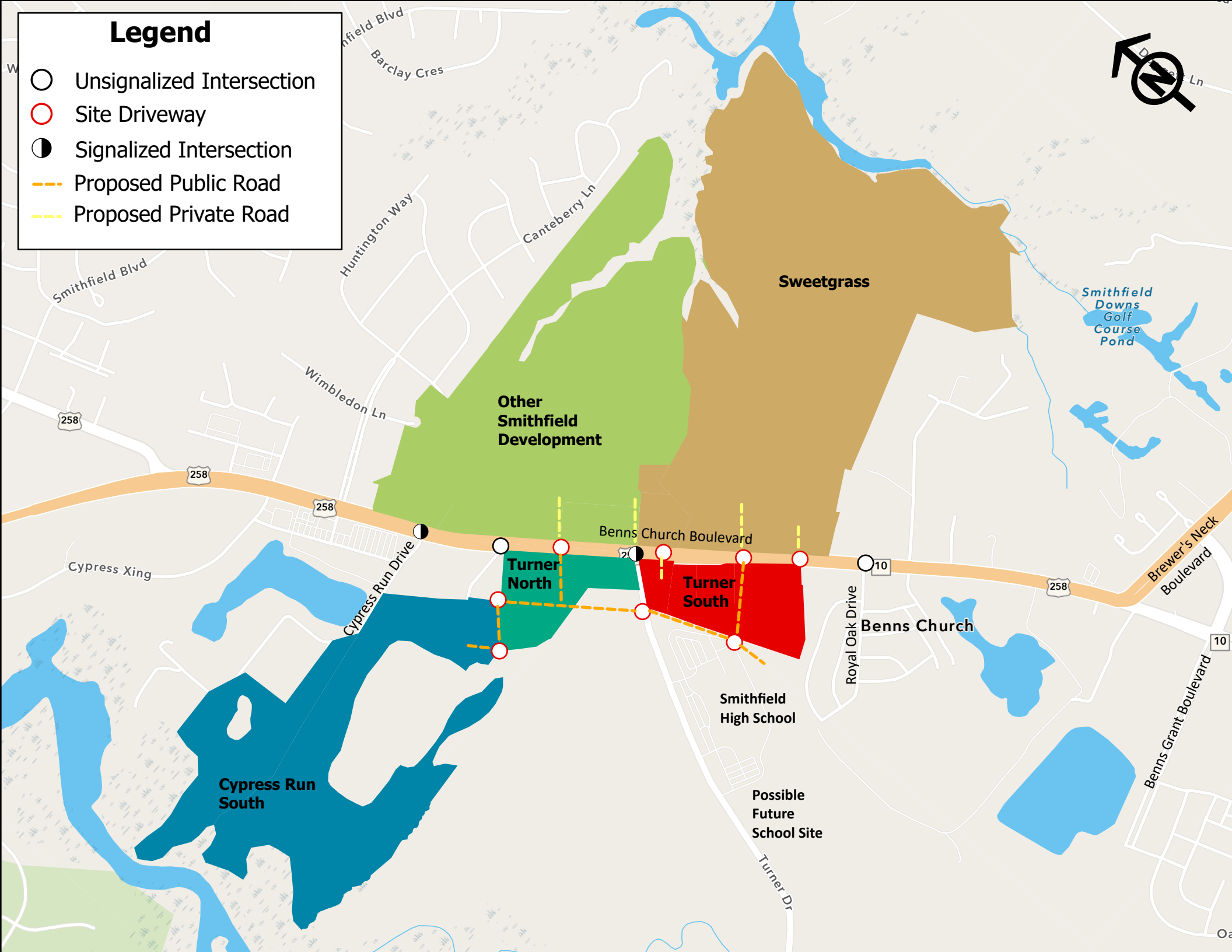

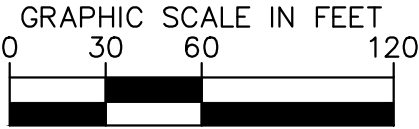
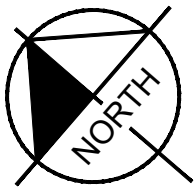

ISSUE:

Discussion of the Proposed Farmers Market Project

BACKGROUND:

At its regular meeting on October 20, 2022, the Board adopted a motion to commit funding in an amount up to, but not to exceed, \$1.4 million towards the development of a new public market subject to the negotiation of terms acceptable to the County to include, but limited to, design, management and ongoing maintenance.

The Board may wish to discuss the potential farmers market project to determine next steps and how it might want to proceed in partnership with the Town of Smithfield.

ISSUE:

Discussion of a Small Business Initiative Relative to the Business License Fee

BACKGROUND:

Currently, any business with annual gross receipts less than \$4,000 is not required to obtain an Isle of Wight County business license. The Commissioner of the Revenue is proposing a small business initiative that will increase the minimum threshold for annual gross receipts from \$4,000 to \$25,000. The initiative is anticipated to have a minimal impact on County revenues.
